This note just in from Dave Millis:

JULY FIELD TRIP TO BANCROFT, ONTARIO

The first collecting day is the 15th. Most popular sites are, Bear Lake and Schikler for Apatite, calcite and Fluorite; Beryl pit for Tourmaline, Amazonite and beryl crystals; Miller site and the Fluoristerite road cut. The sites will be picked by consensus except Thursday will be Schikler, and Friday is a day you can go off on your own. Field trips start at 8 o'clock at Bancroft campground (613-332-3673); you do not have to camp there. Field trips end Sunday; I'm staying until Wednesday AM.

Crossing the border into Canada is easy -- avoid the "5 Fires": Firewater, Firesticks, Firearms, Fireworks, and Firecrackers. Crossing back is harder. Again, avoid the 5 Fires! Bring your passport or enhanced drivers' license. Your rocks must be free of soil that may contain biologics, maximum purchases duty-free after a 48-hr visit is \$400 US per person per car. Taking pets along is a bad idea. If you do, a current rabies vaccine certificate is required both ways. The best currency exchange rates are with a credit card but you will need some cash.

Minutes from the last meeting: Our June meeting had 13 people in attendance. The meeting was called to order at 6:38 PM We went around the room with introductions. Scott presented the Treasurer's report. No minutes were read from the last meeting. Under "Advertising", there was no "new" news, other than the Watertown Daily Times was contacted and corrected about the day of our monthly meetings by Heather. Bob said we have about 45 signs for this year and made a motion to buy 100 bases which will be \$1.89 each. Bob will get in touch with Chris and make sure the diameter of the wires will fit. Probably need < 1/4'. Lisa 2nd the motion to buy 10 new signs. Bill made a foldout map with distribution areas for the signs. We have 36 drop points. Lisa asked if we order 100 bases would we need more signs? Bill did not think so. Bob checked inventories of geodes and signs in storage; he reported that we have about 4 boxes of geodes that were left over from last year. Scott

Heather said she would talk with Mike Rigel from the geology dept at SUNY Potsdam to see if she could get some students to help with the geodes and maybe mineral identifications. We talked about a memorial collage for Sky. Dino Zack volunteered to do this for us. The pictures will be returned after the show if donor's names are on the back. He said he and his family would be happy to do this and the club will mail the pictures back to contributors afterwards.

We have moved the registration table at the show this year to the far end of the building. We will need a sign outside pointing or showing that there are more vendors inside the clubhouse.

Fern called Bob Taillon and offered for him to pick out a specimen to be auctioned off at the show. Bob picked a large purple and white polished agate, 2' x $1 \frac{1}{2}$ ' in size.

George and Sue Robinson are working on cataloguing and evaluations Schuyler's collection.

Ideas for the auction: Everyone come and receive a hat that was Skylers. Also decorate around the room and photo collage with the hats or club table.

Scott would like to see the club pay for entry fees to members only, for club sponsored digs. Up to \$10.00 each. Bob made a motion that we do this and Heather 2nd the motion. All passed in favor.

George noted that another great trip for the club would be the Ottawa Canadian Museum of Nature, it is not that far. Bill has contacted Jamie Knowldon of Gouverneur Minerals to see if we could go on a trip to Harrisville Valentine Mine. Awaiting a call from Jamie, the Gen. Manager. Jerry Curcio brought minerals to pass out to anyone who wanted them from Lockport Quarry. Nice Selenite gypsum samples!

George Robinson won this month's door prize: a beautiful geode! Congratulations George.

Dino talked about minerals for the kits for kids, we have lots left but some of the prettier ones we need to replenish. We will get what we need by collecting some, or donations, and procure what we need at the Syracuse show.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:50.
