## **Minutes from the Last Meeting**

Nine members attended the Sept. meeting. Chris Sutherland won the door prize. Joanna read the minutes from the last meeting and Chris gave her treasurer's report which included totals from the show. It looks like our show did about \$1,000 dollars more this year than last. We lost money on the dinners again this year and on the t-shirts. The big money-maker was the auction of course. We also sold more tickets on the cathedral. We had a recap of the show. Dino raffled a fluorescent mineral specimen this year instead of a light. We had about 3 participants on the Sat. field trip to Powers Farm; Sunday a few more. None of the members present heard any of the radio ads this year. Many saw the articles in the newspapers. Dino did a great job with the kid's mineral hunt and got lots of donations for the hunt. Should have some left for next year's hunt. We will also go online this year to buy minerals for the kids where it's possible to purchase at better cost. Bob, Bruno, Wes Jennings, Ken West, Dave Millis, and Bill Chapman were some of the names mentioned

who were helpers. It was suggested that we hold the auction next year on Sat. right after the show closes at 4PM. We sold about 18 less dinners this year than we needed to sell to break even. That way there will be plenty of light and whoever wishes can go out for dinner afterwards. The geodes did not sell as well this year, and it was noted that they were not as good as other years. Let's get our geodes from a different vendor next year if we can. Volcanic-based geodes vs. concretionary! We did have a few less vendors this year.

A special thank you to Heather ("Ha Ha") O'Hara for her auctioneer efforts at the show this year. She did an excellent job helping Sky with the auction. There was much discussion on going to Herkimer to have a pocket opened up. We talked about sending out notices to all club members and having a vote on whether or not we should consider this. Talked about the possible costs to anyone involved, talked about dates, etc. In the end Chris Sutherland made a motion that the club wait until next year to consider this again. Chris opined that it was not fair that two people should "go for free". Bill and others explained that no one goes "for free". The \$1,500 was to "open it up" for the club. Each year the club has purchased a new UV light to add to the inventory of lamps used for Dino's immensely popular "Fluorescent Mineral Hunt For Kids". We never seem to have enough!
