Minutes from the September Club Meeting @ Canton Library:

Mineral Club Meeting Sept. 7th, 2022. 24 members attended.

The meeting started at 6:25 PM after everyone relished "show celebration pizza" from Sergie's. We went around the room with introductions. Bill showed everyone the T-shirt he was wearing as he introduced himself as club president. Its colorful graphics read: "I am a Rockaholic". Paisley gave the Treasurer's report and profit statement from the show Bill said next year we are going to have to raise admission fees to keep pace with increased costs and that revenues should be in the neighborhood of \$1,000 more if we raise the admission to \$4,00 for adults. Bob Taillon asked "should we do that?" Heather O'Hara said the vendor tables should go up as well. They are \$35.00 per table now, so they would go up to \$40.00. Under "Field trips" Noah recommended going to Moon Lake for apatite. Moon Lake is SW of Gouverneur heading from Oxbow to Theresa. Bill said he was there many years ago. The big crystals that he dug were 3 to 4 feet down. Large green/blue crystals. We would need to get permission from the land owner. Scott Sutherland said the property owner owns up to the middle of the road. The location is next to the road, but not easy digging; mostly hammering, chiseling, and sledge work. Bill asked if there was a consensus to go back to the Hall Farm. Noah also said the Jennings Farm for albite crystals and "Salamander cave" would be good areas; former member Dave Lalonde owns the Salamander cave. There was mention of Sterling Mine. Jerry Curcio said that Olive Horning owns the mine and she has left the area for this year. Maybe next year in the Spring when she comes back. Jerry also said he would like to go to Bush Farm, for the brown tourmaline. We all decided on a field trip to Powers Farm on Oct. 2nd meeting first at the Pierrepont Town Barn, Rt. 24 @8:30 departing by car caravan at 8:45 AM. Under "show recap" Bill noted over 1360 people attended the show.

T-shirts did well this year we will be a little up on sales with about 8 or so tote bags left and a few t-shirts too. Heather asked about getting quotes from other sales companies. Bill said all companies would have been costlier this year because of shipping backlogs and items just not available. We had to do much leg work on our own to find the t-shirts and colors we wanted, esp. pink; we did get them at sale price by doing the leg work. The chestnut shirts were not available therefore our vendor obtained the closest color match they could. Not an easy task! Bill said he would like to order them soon for next year's show. Heather asked "why do we even do advertising?" Scott said maybe do the silent auction every hour if enough good stuff is available. Bill said it was trial and error this year; that's the reason it was done every couple hours or so. Club members might need to donate specimens in the future in order to keep auction and club tables supplied with specimens, perhaps something they found on a club-sponsored field trip, etc. Heather asked "What is the incentive for helping at the show?" Bob mentioned that T-shirts used to be free. Joanna said that was many years ago. Other years they were five dollars to club members who worked at the show. This year they were \$10.00 for show helpers. Suggestions for next year: Add helpers especially at end of the show. If you sign up as a show helper and can't make it, please call and let us know so we can find someone else to replace vou! Reinstitute: "Show Chair" No 50/50/ raffle? Could be too much, although last year it was very successful, and fun.

Placing the Amethyst cathedral by the club table rather than out front at the registration table was a good move and it looks as though it should be a permanent change.

Advertising: Bob said FB does not cost anything. The club has a page. He posts our ads out to other pages or groups such as yard sale sites, and they can repost and share.

We need to buy new egg cartons for the mineral kits plus we need many new signs and bases. We had "Show and Tell" with minerals Carlene brought from her collection, including specimens from the Hall farm near Gouverneur. Jason Fogg brought a specimen to be examined. Brenden Whitman brought raw Ethiopian Opals that he was polishing up.

The meeting ended with Brandon Rawson winning the door prize of a pair of sliced and polished septarian nodule halves.

Bob gave a big (and much appreciated) "Thank You" to Bill and Joanna "for all the work they do". There was a round of applause. The meeting adjourned at 7:20 PM.
