

The Club Table doubled proceeds this year. John Willson did an excellent job on selling cathedral this year. the most ever tickets Roy suggested a bigger sign for "Auction Open to All". We also talked about having a silent auction Bill will send out \$500.00 for next year. Scholarship checks each to St. Lawrence and Potsdam Geology Departments. Motion for this by Barb; 2nd by Roy. Also thank-you notes to Mike Rygel, Paige, and Brian Carl for helping at the mineral ID table. Roy suggested, having a separate, smaller, card table for field trip signups. Area was congested this year. Other suggestions include additional helpers at shows' end to help gather tables and chairs, reinstitute the "Show Chair", purchase two shorter 50' extension cords, continue with 50-50 raffles, keep amethyst cathedral inside by the club table, purchase new "mineral kits" egg cartons with space for the club stamp, improve social media presence.
